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Authors submitting a paper do so on the understanding that it has been read and approved by all authors and that all authors agree to the submission of the manuscript. The number of authors is limited to 6; the inclusion of more than 6 authors must be justified in writing.

All authors should have made substantial contributions to all of the following:

The conception and design of the study, or acquisition of data, analysis and interpretation of data, drafting the article or revising it critically for important intellectual content and final approval of the version to be submitted. Minor contributors and non-contributory clinicians should be acknowledged at the end of the text and before the references. The corresponding author is responsible for ensuring that all authors are aware of their obligations. Please download the form and send it to the Editorial Office. (PDF version or word version) It is advisable to prevent delay.

**Ethical Approvals:**

Experimentation involving human subjects will be published in the international journal of multidisciplinary health sciences only if such research has been conducted in full accordance with ethical principles, including the World Medical Association Declaration of Helsinki and any additional requirements of the country in which the research was conducted. Manuscripts must include a statement that the experiments were undertaken with the understanding and written consent of each subject and according to the above mentioned principles. A statement regarding the fact that the study has been independently reviewed and approved by an ethical board should also be included.

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Editors reserve the right to reject papers if there is doubt as to whether appropriate procedures have been used.

## **Manuscript:**

The manuscripts should be typed in A4 size (212 × 297 mm) paper, with margins of 1 inch from all the four sides. Use 2 spacing throughout. Number pages consecutively, beginning with the title page. The language should be UK English.

**Following peer-review**, authors are required to resubmit their revised paper within 3 weeks; in exceptional circumstances, this timeline may be extended at the editor's discretion.

## **Presentation of Manuscripts**

- Name and address of the department or institution to which the work should be attributed

### **2. Article file:**

- Abstract

The second page should carry the full title of manuscript and an abstract for case report- no more than 150 words and original article – 250 words. The abstract should

be structured and state the Context (Background), Aims, Settings and Design, Methods and Material, Statistical analysis used, Results and Conclusions.

For Literature Review: the structured form for an original article can be followed but is not Mandatory

- Keywords - Below the abstract should provide 3-10 keywords.

The following maximum length will be considered for publication.

Short communication: 1000 words, 8-10 references

Case reports - no more than 1000-1500 words, 10 references and 4 figures

Clinical papers: no more than 2000 words and 15-20 references

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Letters to the editor: should be short, decisive observation. Up to 500 words and 5 references

- References: The accuracy of references is the responsibility of the author. All authors or groups of authors cited in the article must appear in the list of references and vice versa. The list of references at the end of the paper should be arranged as they appear in the article and numbered, and must contain the name of all authors. Do not include unpublished data and personal communication in the references

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Internet pages and online resources may be included within the text and should state as a minimum the author(s), title and full URL. The date of access should be supplied and all URLs should be checked again at proof stage.

- Tables: Number tables, in Arabic numerals, consecutively in the order of their first citation in the text and supply a brief title for each. Place explanatory matter in footnotes, not in the heading.

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Submit good quality colour images. Each image should be less than 400 kb in size. Size of the image can be reduced by decreasing the actual height and width of the images (keep up to 1024x760 pixels or 5 inches). All figures uploaded as .tif or .jpg format with a resolution not less than 300 dpi All image formats (jpeg, tiff, gif, bmp, png, eps, etc.) are acceptable; jpeg is most suitable. Do not zip the files. Figures supplied in colour will appear in colour in the online version of the journal.

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Identifying information should not be published in written descriptions, photographs, sonograms, CT scans, etc., unless the information is essential for scientific purposes and the patient (or parent or guardian) gives written informed consent for publication.

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
